It was published in *Die Zeit ohne Beispiel*.

The essential English leadership secret does not depend on particular intelligence. Rather, it depends on a remarkably stupid thick-headedness. The English follow the principle that when one lies, one should lie big, and stick to it. **They keep up their lies, even at the risk of looking ridiculous.**
